New concept will be 'paradise' for wine, beer and spirits lovers

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A cross between Total Wine, banquet hall and wine bar, Paradise Wine is coming soon to the Pavilion Shopping Center in North Naples. Owners Leigh Benoliel and Blaine East promise 3,000 wines, 1,200 liquors and 800 craft beers in their retail operation. Several in-house selections will also be available on tap at two tasting bars and the full-service bar.

The idea was born when Ms. Benoliel and Mr. East watched a friend enjoy runaway success with a similar concept in North Carolina. It was so popular that there ended up being three stores, Ms. Benoliel says about the sip-while-youshop experience.

She and Mr. East worked in their friend's flagship store for about six months before deciding to do some reconnaissance in Florida for opening their own store. A Florida native who had enjoyed a career in developing shopping centers, Mr. East was eager to return to the Sunshine State. Ms. Benoliel had worked as a producer and editor for network television and was ready for a change in scenery from southern California.

'We drove from one end of Tamiami Trail to the other, and when we came to Naples, I said, 'This is the place," Ms. Benoliel says. After three more trips, Mr. East was also convinced.

Paradise Wine will open in the former site of Anthony's Ladies Apparel. In addition to the retail operation, there will

catering kitchen and a 3,000-square-foot draft local restaurants and catering compatio where guests will be able to enjoy their purchases.

Ms. Benoliel describes it as "80 percent retail, 20 percent infotainment," meaning that customers will not only find a wide variety of beverages to purchase, they will also be able to avail themselves of classes curated by Director of Wine Education Jim Morris and presented by a wide variety of experts from the shop's distributors and suppliers.

Bartender and restaurant competitions will give professionals in the local food and wine industry the chance to compete to have their creations featured at Parabe an event space, an education room, a dise Wine, and the partners also hope to
