

NCEF Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the funding cycle for a traditional grant?

July 1st -June 30th

2. How do I apply for an NCEF grant?

Applications open in June and are due the third week in August. The application link can be found on the <u>Grant Recipients</u> page of the NCEF website.

3. How do I know if my organization is eligible for an NCEF grant?

The <u>Grant Guidelines</u> (found on the Grant Recipients Page) explain the eligibility requirements.

4. When will I be notified if my application was accepted for funding?

Award notifications are made in mid-February, following the annual Naples Winter Wine Festival. Notifications are sent via the online grants management system.

5. How much should I apply for?

NCEF's philosophy is to invest in a smaller number of organizations in order to make a greater impact. Funding typically <u>does not exceed</u>:

- 50% of a program's operational budget or
- 25% of an organization's annual operating budget

6. Does NCEF fund start-ups?

No. NCEF looks to invest in organizations with a proven track record of successful outcomes. An organization must be in operation, serving children in Collier County, for at least one year prior to applying.

7. I just applied to the IRS to become a 501 (c) 3, can I apply?

You must be officially awarded 501 (c) 3 status by the time your application is submitted.

8. What are the reporting requirements if we are awarded a grant from NCEF?

All grantees are required to submit quarterly impact reports. The report questions primarily focus on outcomes and quarterly expenditures and are submitted via an online grants management system.

9. If our service area is outside of Collier County, can we apply?

NCEF only awards grants to organizations that serve children in Collier County. If your organization serves children in Collier County, and beyond, NCEF funds are restricted to serving Collier County children only.

10. Can I apply as an individual/family for direct grant support of my child?

No. NCEF funding is only awarded to registered 501 (c) 3 organizations that serve at-risk and underprivileged children.

11. WillI have an opportunity to present my request to the Grant Committee?

Unfortunately, with the large of amount of grant applications that NCEF receives each year, there is not enough time to allow for presentations of your request. If clarifying questions are needed, a staff member from the Grants Dept. will reach out to the grant contact.

12. Can I apply to be an NCEF Strategic Initiative Partner?

No. Strategic Initiative Partners, also known as Blueprint Partners, undergo a vetting process and are established beneficiaries. Whether an organization fits within a Strategic Initiative is determined by the Grant Committee, and decisions regarding inclusion in an initiative are made accordingly.
