

CHILD ADVOCACY

This includes individuals, professionals and organizations that speak for and protect our community's most vulnerable children by providing a voice, shelter, crisis counseling mentorship and the essentials to help them overcome the challenges they face.

OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME

Programs that operate during after-school, holiday and summertime hours improve engagement in learning by helping young people build stronger relationships with adults, foster better work habits and increase feelings of personal efficacy.



EARLY LEARNING

A child's early years lay the foundation for their lifetime. Enriched learning experiences stimulate a child's growth in all key developmental areas. An environment with well-educated and caring staff, high program standards and a curriculum based on a child's developmental needs is critical to that child's long-term success.

HEALTHCARE

NCEF grants provide essential medical and healthcare services that have measurable outcomes and a life-changing impact.

Therapeutic intervention modalities include applied behavioral analysis, counseling, equine therapy, speech and language therapy and therapeutic recreation.



A Blueprint for Success

NCEF commissioned in-depth assessments of the needs of children in Collier County. These studies proved to be a comprehensive overview of the status of child well-being in our community.

Several significant gaps in basic services for Collier County children were identified. In response to these findings, the Trustees of NCEF elected to look beyond their annual grants program and proactively engage in strategic partnerships with local non-profits, local colleges, universities and other foundations to create long-term solutions to fill these voids.

NCEF's unique approach, which emphasizes collaboration between organizations and bridges public and private resources, has become a blueprint for how to transform a community, one issue at a time. Working creatively with other private or public charitable entities, NCEF has established seven major Strategic Initiatives using the Blueprint Model.

The Blueprint Partners included within NCEF's Strategic Initiatives exemplify the highest levels of efficacy and accountability by collaborating to optimize funding and developing innovative programs to deliver high-quality programs and services.



Early Learning

Everything Starts with Baby Steps

This multi-faceted initiative for children, from birth to 5 years old, enhances teacher quality, access, and affordability of education-focused care—components that research deemed deficient in Collier County.

Since inception, over 59,000 high-risk children ages 6 months to 5 years entered school with more learning tools by attending high-quality early childhood education programs.

Healthcare

Prevention is the Best Medicine

Children in need are provided with essential medical and healthcare services that have measurable outcomes and a life-changing impact.

Since 2006, nearly 270,000 pediatric patient visits have been conducted between the Isabel Collier Read Medical Campus in Immokalee and Healthcare Network's Nichols Community Health Center in Golden Gate.

A Recipe for Success

Nutritious meals are supplied to children and their families who struggle with food insecurity, (the fear of not knowing where their next meal will come from).

Since 2011, nearly 30 million nutritious meals have been distributed to children and families in need and, in 2023 alone, 8,451,889 meals were served, accounting for nearly one-third the overall total.

Through the holistic integration of primary care and behavioral health services, children's mental health issues can be identified and prevented.

Since 2012, over 75,000 youth have received effective and coordinated mental health services and treatment.

A Smile is Worth a Thousand Words

Dental care for at-risk and underserved children is provided through the NCEF Pediatric Dental Center, Healthcare Network's Nichols Community Health Center and a mobile sealant program.

Over 186,259 pediatric dental visits have been provided by the NCEF Pediatric Dental Center since it opened its doors in December 2008.

Vision *Seeing is Believing*

Children in Collier County's Title I* schools are ensured to receive professional vision screenings and when medically appropriate, also receive full eye exams and two pairs of glasses (one for home and school).

*Title l refers to schools with high numbers or high percentages of children who are disadvantaged.

176,603 vision screenings + 44,595 glasses dispensed since 2012.
